This project was inspired by the National Women's History Project and the Nevada Women's History Project in Reno. It is designed to collect the stories of Douglas County women. All information collected becomes part of the permanent archives, housed in the Van Sickle Research Center at the Carson Valley Museum and Cultural Center in Gardnerville and with the Women in History Project, Reno.



This year's inductees included: Elizabeth "Betty" Chism Cordes, Mary Settlemyer Fair, Pamela A. Horton, Sherry Smokey, and Dorothea Wennhold Springmeyer. Artifacts reflecting the life and times of these women are now on display at the CVM&CC, Parlor Room.

From the minute a guest walks in the front door, they are greeted by a friendly, knowledgeable volunteer sitting at the reception desk. These volunteers freely give up a part of their day because they love the history and traditions of Carson Valley and want to share it with our guests. We have front line volunteers and many behind the scenes too. Volunteers with experience in finance, home maintenance, exhibits room decoration and food service just to name a few. Some of our volunteers work more than one area and are happy to do so. Over the next issues of our newsletter I will be highlighting some of our volunteers!



Please meet Mary Kammann, she is our head Docent in charge of leading tours that are here visiting our museums from area schools, retirement homes or special travel agents. Mary has trained several additional volunteers to assist her. She also helps train docents and new volunteers for the reception desk.

We are open 6 days a week at our Gardnerville museum from 10am to 4pm. That's two – three hour shifts for our front desk volunteers, and that equals 12 volunteers a week or 48 shifts a month and we double that amount in May through October when we open the Genoa Courthouse Museum, which is open 7 days a week! That is in addition to the many other important areas where other volunteers are needed.

# From the Bookstore

---



In our bookstore we carry interesting Native American crafts, as well as books, for both adults and children. Featured this month are the Traditional Native American style small baskets. These are kits to weave and include detailed instructions. The kits are of different difficulty levels, ranging from the Twined Basket Kit for beginners, to the Coiled Basket Kit which is more difficult. Both are shown in our photo.

We carry a number of Dover Coloring Books for Children. Our featured book is North American Indian Crafts. Each page has extensive, fact-filled captions accompanying the 39 detailed, accurately rendered illustrations of North American Indian peoples engaged in typical craft activities. Fun and informative!

For the adults we have two books regarding Indian weaving. Weavers of Tradition and Beauty – Basketmakers of the Great Basin tells the story of 19 modern Indian weavers, who have inherited an ancient and time honored tradition of “ways with the willow”. Along with the stories of these men and women are many pictures, not only of baskets, but also of their dances, ceremonies and legends.

Our other book about basketry and weaving is Great Basin Basketmakers – Weaving Naturally in the Great Basin. This is a guide to harvesting and preparing plant materials for basketry. It is a fascinating book, even if you have no intention of actually making a basket. Many drawings and pictures of plants and how each is used in basketry, make this book an enjoyable read.

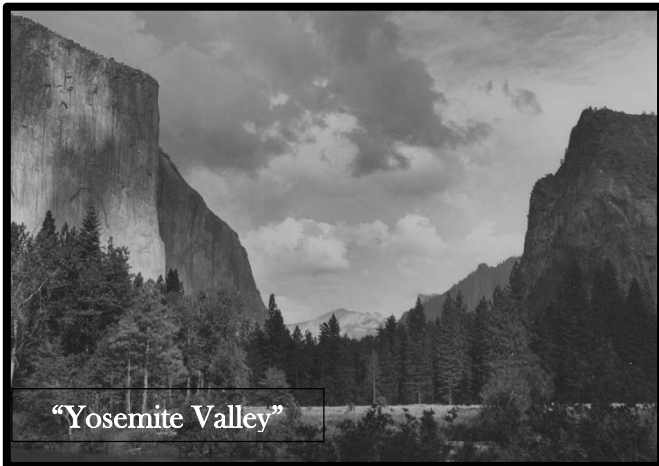
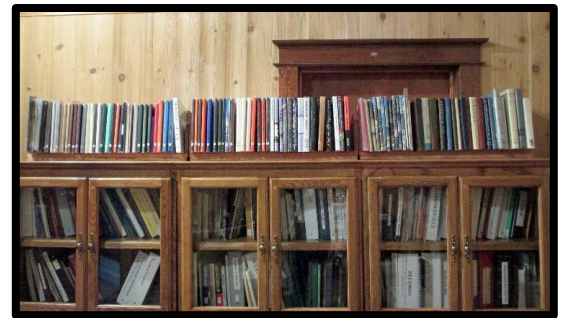

With this updated Van Sickle Research Center, we continue our commitment to our organizational Mission Statement:

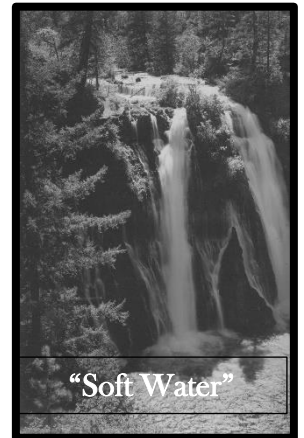
